## INTRODUCTION

In an article in Chappell and Wilson's *The Australian Criminal Justice System*, A.G. Hess has pointed to the need for the establishment in Australia of a national clearinghouse, to function as a 'centralised information unit which serves as a source of data and/or information to research workers and practitioners in the field'.

The Australian Institute of Criminology has established such a clearinghouse and a great deal of information concerning Australian and Australian-related publications, completed and on-going research is being collected. This information is being computerised to enable an efficient criminological information retrieval system to be developed.

In the belief that duplication of research is undesirable, particularly in a field where manpower and funds are scarce, the Institute has decided to use this *Information Bulletin* as a means of disseminating information concerning Australian or Australian-related publications and research of criminological significance. Also included is information supplied by correspondents from each Australian State and the Northern Territory as to criminological seminars and meetings which take place in their respective jurisdictions. However, information from any source regarding matter to be included in the *Information Bulletin* would be welcomed and should be sent to the Editorial Committee.

The *Information Bulletin* is published quarterly and readers who would like a statement of their current or recently completed research to appear in the *Information Bulletin* are requested to detach from this issue the appropriate page, to complete it and return it to the address below.

Readers will appreciate that the clearinghouse information contained in the *Information Bulletin* is based largely on direct information supplied by individuals and departments and can only be as accurate and reliable as its source.

The Australian Institute of Criminology appreciates the response which it has already received in establishing the clearinghouse and it is hoped that the service it provides will assist the promotion of Australian research into criminological problems which urgently require attention.

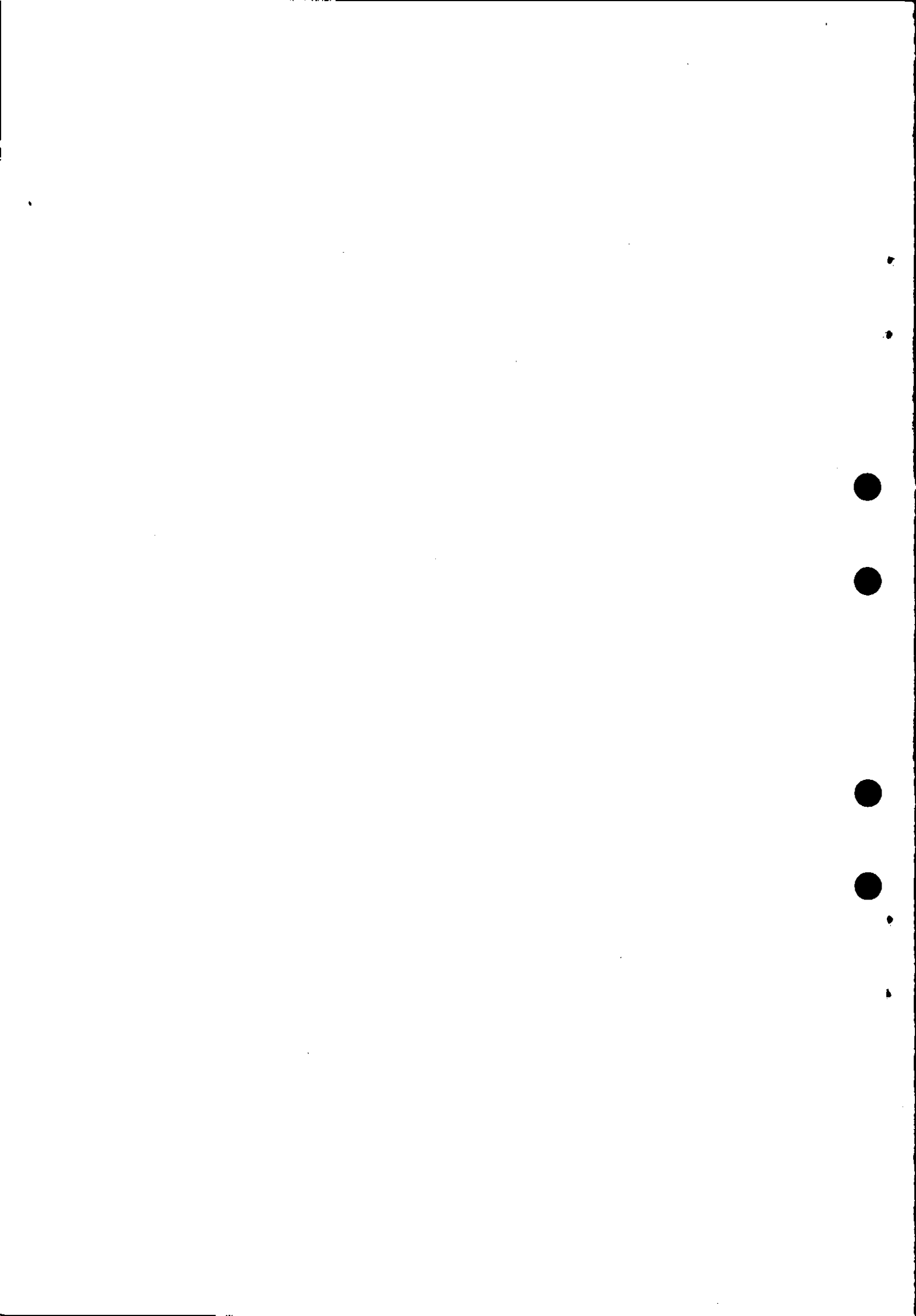

Topic: Alcohol Drugs and Driving (A.L.R.C. 4)

Funding: The Commission

Outline: This Reference requires an urgent report by the Commission on the reform of the ACT Motor Traffic Ordinance relating to the offences connected with the driving of motor vehicles whilst under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.

The Reference follows recent criticism of the current law by the Supreme Court of the ACT. Copy of the Terms of Reference was previously sent. The Commission's report is proceeding according to plan and should be in the hands of legislative draftsmen by mid-May 1976.

### 71 LAW REFORM

Topic: Law Reform Digest  
Auspices: The Law Reform Commission  
Researchers: The entire research staff of the Commission

Commencement and anticipated completion: Commenced January 1976. For completion during 1976.

Funding: The Commission

Outline: The Commission is improving upon an Interim Law Reform Digest which was prepared in December 1975 and widely distributed in January 1976. The Digest is arranged in accordance with the titles and paragraphs of the Second Edition of the Australian Digest (Law Book Company) and on the First Edition for titles not covered in the Second Edition, to allow ready research access to suggestions and proposals to the reform of the law in Australasia.

The Digest will also contain reference to overseas law reform reports, royal commission reports and other like research material. The final format of the Digest is for discussion among the Australasian Law Reform agencies and with the Law Departments of the Commonwealth, the States, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea.

Commencement and anticipated completion: The Reference was given on 9 April 1976. It is hoped to complete the Reference within three years.

Funding: The Commission

Outline: The Reference is at its initial stage. It is a comprehensive Reference in relation to the suggestion of new laws for the protection of individual privacy in Australia.

## Terms of Reference – To Inquire into and Report Upon:

1. the extent to which undue intrusions into or interferences with privacy arise or are capable of arising under the laws of the Commonwealth Parliament or of the Territories, and the extent to which procedures adopted to give effect to those laws give rise to or permit such intrusions or interferences, with particular reference to but not confined to the following matters:
  - (a) the collection, recording or storage of information by Commonwealth or Territory Departments, authorities or corporations, or by persons or corporations licensed under those laws for purposes related to the collection, recording, storage or communication of information;

- (b) the communication of the information referred to in sub-paragraph (a) to any Government Department, or to any authority, corporation or person;
  - (c) without limiting the operation of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b), the collection, recording, storage and communication of information obtained pursuant to the Health Insurance Act 1973-1975 and the Health Insurance Commission Act 1973;
  - (d) powers of entry on premises or search of persons or premises by police and other officials; and
  - (e) powers exercisable by persons or authorities other than courts to summon the attendance of persons to answer questions or produce documents;
2. (a) what legislative or other measures are required to provide proper protection and redress in the cases referred to in paragraph 1;
- (b) what changes are required in the law in force in the Territories to provide protection against, or redress for, undue intrusions into or interferences with privacy arising, *inter alia*, from the obtaining, recording, storage or communication of information in relation to individuals, or from entry onto private property with particular reference to, but not confined to, the following:
- i data storage;
  - ii the credit reference system;
  - iii debt collectors;
  - iv medical, employment, banking and like records;
  - v listening, optical, photographic and other like devices;
  - vi security guards and private investigators;
  - vii entry onto private property by persons such as collectors, canvassers and salesmen;
  - viii employment agencies;
  - ix press, radio and television;
  - x confidential relationships such as lawyer and client and doctor and patient.

3. any other related matter;

but excluding inquiries on matters falling within the Terms of Reference of the Royal Commission on Intelligence and Security or matters relating to national security or defence.

In Making Its Inquiry and Report the Commission will:

- (a) have regard to its function in accordance with section 6(1) of the Act to consider proposals for uniformity between laws of the Territories and laws of the States; and
- (b) note the need to strike a balance between protection of privacy and the interests of the community in the development of knowledge and information, and law enforcement.

It was found that, in sentencing, most weight is attached to Child Welfare Officer's recommendation. When no recommendation is made, the greatest weight is carried by the number of the offender's previous court appearances. Next in importance are the number of current charges, type of offense, the offender's plea, his age, and number of previous charges, in that order. Of least importance are the location of the court, circumstances of offender's current residence, and types of previous sentence. Apart from C.W.O.'s recommendation, in specific sentencing decisions the number of previous court appearances is most weighty in committal to an institution and in admonishment, offender's plea and circumstances of residence carry most weight in admonishment, his age in fines, and types of previous sentence in decisions involving committal to an institution. The findings were discussed critically.
