Introduction

Due to staffing restriction in the J.V. Barry Memorial Library, two years have elapsed since the last issue of the *Information Bulletin of Australian Criminology* (Vol.9 No.1 June 1982). An increase in staff has enabled the Library to recommence the production of the *Information Bulletin* with a new series (Vol.1 No.1 June 1984).

To begin the new series it has been decided that current material received in the Library from April 1984 will be indexed. However, at some time in the future (yet to be decided) it is hoped that journals and monographs from June 1982 to April 1984 will be indexed and published in a single issue to complete vol.9. A few changes have been made to the *Information Bulletin*. Despite the value of indexing Parliamentary Debates (Commonwealth, A.C.T. and State) it was decided that on past experience it was not possible to keep up with the volume of material and it was also difficult to obtain the material from the States. Therefore these will no longer be indexed. The list of journals has been revised and will continue to be an annual feature. References relating to New Zealand and Papua New Guinea will, as in the past, be included in material indexed.

In this issue, the sections 'Current Research', 'Recently Completed Research' which incorporates Criminology Research grants, include all research from June 1983. To obtain information for current and completed research for both the Australian Institute of Criminology and the Criminology Research Council for the period June 1982 to June 1983, please consult the 1983 Annual Reports for both bodies.

Training seminars held since June 1982 are listed in this issue together with a note of any publications resulting from the seminars. Forthcoming seminars are listed as usual.

For this issue only, a list of Australian criminological monographs accessioned in the J.V. Barry Memorial Library from 1982 to date replaces the 'J.V. Barry Memorial Library Select List of Accessions' (overseas monographs) and is arranged by subject. This list will not be indexed.

The Australian Institute of Criminology has approximately fifty folders for the *Information Bulletin*. These may be obtained from the Publications Section at a cost of \$4.50 each.

As part of the Institute's function as a national clearing-house of criminological information, the library maintains a computerised data base, CINCH (Computerised Information from National Criminological Holdings). There are currently 6000 journal citations and 1200 monograph citations on CINCH including material indexed up to September 1978 for journal articles and 1979 for monographs. Requests for bibliographies derived from the CINCH data base should be directed to the Information Services Librarian.

The future of CINCH is under consideration. Librarians in the criminal justice system have recommended that CINCH go on to AUSINET, and this proposal is one of the alternatives being considered. It is not anticipated that CINCH will be updated until a decision has been reached.

The success of the *Information Bulletin* depends to a large extent on material contributed to it by its readers, and persons who would like a statement of their research to appear and wish to publicise conferences or seminars are invited to complete the appropriate forms supplied with each issue and return them to the address below.

Readers will appreciate that the information contained in the *Information Bulletin* can only be as accurate and reliable as its source.

The Australian Institute of Criminology hopes that the services provided by this publication prove valuable to those interested in criminology and looks forward to the continued interest and assistance of its readers.
