The Australian Institute of Criminology has established a national clearinghouse of criminological information, and as part of its function the library maintains a computerised data base CINCH (Computerised Information from National Criminological Holdings). There are currently 6000 journal citations and 1200 monograph citations on CINCH including material indexed up to September 1978 for journal articles and 1979 for monographs. Requests for bibliographies derived from the CINCH data base should be directed to the Information Services Librarian.

The *Information Bulletin of Australian Criminology* is published quarterly. It contains information regarding 'Currently and Recently Completed Research', past and forthcoming seminars in Australian and bibliographical activities of the J.V. Barry Memorial Library. It also generally aims to encourage a greater interchange of information between all persons interested in Australian criminology. In future papers from published conferences and chapters in monographs will be indexed.

In addition, an issue of fundamental importance for consideration of the Commission will be a Commonwealth Act, incorporating the general provisions of Commonwealth law governing the punishment of Commonwealth and Territorial offenders. The Commission proposes to append to its final Report a Bill to translate into legislative form the final recommendations on the matters dealt with in ALRC 15, the matters relevant to punishment of persons convicted of offences against the laws of the ACT and the matters abovementioned.

Of immediate concern to the Commission will be the commencement of thoroughgoing consultation processes to obtain feedback in relation to important matters raised in the Interim Report (ALRC 15). In addition comments and submissions are invited in relation to the matters which will be dealt with by the Commission in its forthcoming research programme. As the work of the Commission proceeds in relation to this second aspect and discussion papers become available, it is hoped to consult widely within the community including the relevant professional associations.
