



CINCH Announcement

CINCH (Computerised Information from National Criminological Holdings) was established by the Australian Institute of Criminology in Canberra in 1976. Until now the database has only been available inhouse to Institute Staff.

CINCH is now available as a public access file on AUSINET. Initially the data will comprise of 1982-1985 journal articles and monographs. Material not indexed during the suspension of the Information Bulletin of Australian Criminology will be available online. Eventually the data stored on the CSIRONET computer will be converted to STAIRS format and the database will contain material from as early as the 1920's to the present, including indexed documents comprising books, book reviews, research reports, government documents, conferences, working papers, conference papers, theses, statistical publications, analytical chapters in books and journal articles. The CINCH database when it is fully mounted on AUSINET will contain criminological references from major Australian legal and criminological journals dating back to their first issue. For example the Australian Law Journal from v.1 1927/28-, Sydney Law Review v.1 1953-, Federal Law Review v.1 1964-, Australian and New Zealand Journal of Criminology v.1 1968- and so on. Only those items deemed to have criminological interest were selected, but there will be a tremendously rich source of historical and archival information readily available there.

The 'Recent Publications' section of the Information Bulletin of Australian Criminology will continue to be published. It will be the printed byproduct of the CINCH database and both will be updated quarterly.

The S.C.U. was set up 4 years ago as a 'therapeutic community' to help certain inmates overcome emotional and/or behavioural problems, and to provide a training facility for prison staff.

Inmates are resident at the Unit for a period of up to 3 months during which time they participate in daily group therapy sessions. All Unit members are awarded points for the quality and quantity of their participation in these sessions and for their educational pursuits and general

behaviour in the Unit.

At the time of entering the Unit, each inmate signs a contract outlining the behavioural goals he will work on during therapy and agreeing to certain community rules. The breach of certain of these rules and/or nonwork in therapy results in dismissal from the Unit.

A senior psychologist oversees the Unit programme aided by a staff of seconded prison officers and trainee prison officers.

The current project aims to evaluate the effectiveness of the Unit in terms of its stated aims and objectives. The study showed that Aborigines and Europeans alike consumed alcohol to an extent that caused grave medical problems, and that among Europeans their alcohol intake was often associated with poor work performance and safety. However, a double standard emerged whereby the European sector of the population consistently focused attention upon subgroups as being 'the problem'. These subgroups include categories of European workers and Aborigines. Large numbers of Aborigines were detailed under protective custody legislation, however, it was found that many of these could be avoided by structural changes to the hotel at which they drank.


