#### CINCH ON AUSTROM

One of the highlights of the year for the Institute has been our participation in the AUSTROM CD-ROM project. Australian Social Science and Education Databases on CD-ROM (AUSTROM) is a co-operative disc with a number of Australian databases, including CINCH. It is published by RMIT Victoria University of Technology and the National Library of Australia, and is available on subscription for \$A1,495 for three fully cumulated discs per year. The first disc was released in June and AUSTROM 2 is due for release in mid December. All of the databases on the original disc, with the exception of IRAB, have been updated on AUSTROM 2 with larger files. This second disc also contains two additional databases: Pinpointer, and Home Economics Index.

One of the problems with the first disc was the lack of a satisfactory front end menu. This problem has been addressed by the Institute's ADP Manager, Dr Francois Debaccker who has designed a program that enables AUSTROM searchers to transfer quickly and easily from one database to another. AUSTROM subscribers will be pleased to know that the publishers of AUSTROM will be issuing a copy of Dr Debaccker's program with every AUSTROM 2 disc.

Searchers who are using the updated AUSTROM disc may wish to check the size of each database from its information screen. For instance, CINCH on AUSTROM has grown from 20,000 records on the first disc, to 20,635 on AUSTROM 2.

with the additional records on Even AUSTROM, searchers are reminded that the different database files are only as current as the tapes of the databases provided to the CD-ROM production team. For most of the AUSTROM 2 databases, this means that the databases are current to August or September 1990. As a consequence, it may be necessary to update an AUSTROM search using an alternative form of that database (if available).

CINCH searchers have two alternative forms for updating AUSTROM searches:

> CINCH on OZLINE; and Australian Criminology Information Bulletin.

OZLINE. When using CINCH online on the National Library's OZLINE Service, searchers wishing to update an AUSTROM search should note that AUSTROM 1 has all CINCH records, up to and including the 9001 update, and AUSTROM 2, up to and including 9003. Using the ..SELECT mode or function, the updating search can be limited to the updates not already covered on AUSTROM.

ACIB. Each issue of the Australian Criminology Information Bulletin contains a recent CINCH update. For instance, the update for this issue is 9004, or the fourth for 1990. As a consequence anyone wishing to update a CINCH search from AUSTROM 1, should consult Vol.1, No.3.+ of the Bulletin. For AUSTROM 2, use Vol.1, No.5+.

#### **CINCH NEWS**

#### **NEW PUBLICATION TYPE**

A new publication type, SERIAL, has been introduced into the CINCH Database. SERIAL describes a record of a serial title which is being indexed once only as a whole, as distinct from ARTICLE, a record describing a specific article in a particular issue of a serial. Thus, the serial titles selected will be those with the same broad subject matter recurring in updated form from issue to issue, such as occurs in annual reports, and priority for indexing will be given to those publications with significant statistical information. Formerly, because individual issues of these types of serials were generally not indexed, a most valuable source of information was lost to the Database.

Fourteen SERIAL records have already been indexed and included in the Database. To retrieve these records when searching CINCH on OZLINE, type: SERIAL.DO. (upper or lower case).

#### **CINCH ANNUAL TO CEASE**

We regret to advise that the publication: CINCH, the Australian Criminology Database, Annual Listing (ISSN 1034-5302) has been discontinued. Annual listings were published in 1987 and 1988, and followed on from a cumulated 1986 volume of the Information Bulletin of Australian Criminology.

Regretably, the sales of the Annual have not been sufficient to justify publication. We would remind subscribers to the CINCH Annual that a print version of the CINCH Database is still available through the Australian Criminology Information Bulletin, and this Bulletin not only provides CINCH updates, but also other criminal justice information, relevant to the work of students, researchers and professionals.

#### **CINCH GROWTH**

CINCH is updated on the National Library's OZLINE Service six times per year. The fifth update of CINCH for 1990 (9005) has increased the size of the Database past the 21,000 mark. The final update for 1990 will be loaded in late December.

# THE JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM OF THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT

The Justice Information System is a combined development effort of four South Australian Government Agencies:

- . Police Department
- Department of Correctional Services
- . Department for Family and Community Services
- . Attorney General's Department

The JIS is being designed and implemented to:

- enable the tracking of an alleged offender from the reporting of a criminal incident, through the apprehension, prosecution, and court proceedings to an eventual outcome, either acquittal, community service or imprisonment.
- facilitate one source for statistics on criminal justice in South Australia.
- provide computing services for the Department for Family and Community Services.

Equipment was brought on site in late 1986 and the network and the first applications were operational in late 1987.

The current situation (December 1990) is as follows:

- . 2 Fujitsu computers (M780/10R + M760/6) installed at a central site
- . Network of 800 terminals and printers throughout South Australia
- . 4800 users including those who are using an electronic mail system
- . 20 applications throughout the member Agencies based on an integrated database management system (CA IDMS/R)
- . sophisticated security and privacy provisions to satisfy the most stringent requirements.

The current schedule provides for all applications (40), to satisfy the above objectives to be operational by June 1992. At that time, there will be approximately 1000 terminals on the network and some 7000 users.

The System has its own computer staff and is managed by a Board of Management comprising the Chief Executive Officers of the above Agencies, chaired by the Commissioner of Police.

The key to JIS is a common integrated database of offenders and events which Agencies share within strict security and privacy provisions. Common coding systems have been adopted by the Agencies and by the Court Services Department. This latter Department has its own computer system which is fully compatible (hardware and software) to JIS and will be linked electronically to ensure the continuity of information.
