#### **EDITORIAL**

Cooperation, exchanges of information, and resource sharing are essential for the effective and efficient operation of our libraries.

The potential for cooperation between libraries has been significantly enhanced by the formation of the World Criminal Justice Library Network in April this year. This issue contains information about the Network and a short report on the Rutgers Conference, at which the Network was established.

#### SOURCE BOOK OF VICTORIAN SEXUAL ASSAULT STATISTICS 1987 -1990

The Community Council Against Violence has conducted a large study of serious sexual offences reported to the Victorian Police from 1987 to 1990. The sample includes 2232 victims who have reported rape, sexual penetration or incest offence to police during this time period. Of this number, there were 1473 victims of a rape offence, 597 sexual penetration victims and 161 incest victims.

Until now there has not been a major study of reported sexual offences in Victoria. The Source Book of Victorian Sexual Assault Statistics provides detailed demographic characteristics of victims and offenders and information about incidents. The Source Book of Victorian Sexual Assault Statistics contains 109 tables including tables on location of the incident, time of occurrence, reporting practices, weapon relationship between victim and offender and whether an arrest was made. #### WORLD CRIMINAL JUSTICE LIBRARY NETWORK ESTABLISHED

The World Criminal Justice Library Network was formed in April this year, at a Conference of Criminal Justice Librarians held at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, at Newark, New Jersey, USA. Representatives from leading criminal justice libraries and documentation centres from around the world attended.

All those who attended were unanimous in their recognition of the increasing demands and pressure placed on criminal justice libraries because of the globalisation of criminal justice in general, and because of an information explosion in the field of criminal justice itself. It is clear that no library can hope to collect everything, or to serve the diverse and increasingly international needs of its clients. Furthermore, the duplication of efforts on the part of all libraries is not cost-beneficial in an era of information explosion accompanied by ever decreasing resources. The necessity to devise a means of saving resources through pooling of information and services is therefore a major reason for establishing the World Criminal Justice Library Network.

#### THE MISSION OF THE NETWORK

Two goals express the mission of the World Criminal Justice Library Network:

- To develop specific ways of sharing services and criminal justice information on a global scale.
- To enhance communication among Network members.

#### WHAT THE NETWORK WILL DO

Members of the Network will meet again in 1993. Until then, particular attention will be paid to the following:

- Membership Directory. A directory of participant libraries will be compiled with information about contacts, holdings, special collections, and other services. This will be made available at cost.
- Union list. The feasibility of developing a union list of criminal justice serials will be investigated.
- Accessions lists. A means of sharing accessions lists of participating libraries will be devised.
- International crime data. National and international crime statistics and criminal justice profiles will be disseminated through online databases and other means.
- Gateways. The Network will assist in identifying other networks and providing access to them.
- Languages. Information about the World Criminal Justice Library Network will be communicated in a number of languages; initially English, French, and Spanish.
- 7. Training and regional development. Members will train other librarians and criminal justice

- specialists in the operation of the Network and related activities. The Network will ensure that communications are established with agencies and libraries in countries not yet adjusted to electronic communications.
- United Nations. The World Criminal Justice Library Network will assist the United Nations in its efforts to disseminate criminal justice information, by working through the United Nations Criminal Justice Information Network (UNCJIN).

#### STEERING COMMITTEE

The Network's steering committee is co-chaired by Phyllis Schultze (NCCD/Rutgers) and Graeme Newman (UNCJIN and SUNY, Albany). The role of the steering committee is to supervise the various projects of the Network. Currently, the other members of the committee are: Martin Lively (National Institute of Justice), Catherine Matthews (University of Toronto), John Myrtle (Australian Institute of Criminology), Slavomir Redo (UN Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Branch), Jacob van Heijst (UN Headquarters, New York), and Duncan McKay (Cambridge University).

The Australian Institute of Criminology is a foundation member of the Network. John Myrtle, the Institute's Librarian attended the Rutgers Conference and is a member of the Network's Steering Committee. ## THE WORLD CRIMINAL JUSTICE LIBRARY CONFERENCE

The World Criminal Justice Library Conference was held at the S.I. Newhouse Center for Law and Justice of Rutgers University, Newark, New Jersey on April 25 and 26 this year. I attended on behalf of the Australian Institute of Criminology.

The aim of the Conference was to establish a network of the leading criminal justice libraries of the world that will maximise their use, distribute responsibility for the development of special collections, develop a means of informing users of the availability of particular items or categories of information and data sets and formulate a protocol for sharing the costs and burdens of providing a comprehensive international criminal justice library service.

The Conference was attended by more than forty participants; including librarians and library managers, information specialists, teachers and directors. A paper was presented on each of the organisations represented at the Conference. Each of these papers gave on outline of the organisation itself, its library, and the resources that it could bring to a worldwide network.

In addition to these country/organisational presentations, there were also presentations from various service providers. Graeme Newman's paper outlined developments with the United Nations Criminal Justice Information Network (UNCJIN). Robert Loeb, Chief Executive of the Telecommunications Cooperative Network spoke about TCN's role as the carrier for UNCJIN.

Three database producers gave presentations. Richard Allinson, proprietor of Willow Tree Press, the publisher of Criminal Justice Abstracts, outlined developments with CJA. The database is already available online through Westlaw and hopefully will also soon be available on CD-ROM. Richard Rosenthal from the National Criminal Justice Research service also

spoke about developments with the NCJRS database, which is available online through DIALOG and now also on CD-ROM. I gave a paper on CINCH and distributed information about the Database itself and the AUSTROM CD-ROM, of which CINCH forms a part.

#### RUTGERS

A highlight of the week in the United States was not only being at the Conference and meeting so many colleagues from the world of criminal justice librarianship, but also being at Rutgers and meeting staff and students from one of the leading criminal justice schools in the USA.

The Rutgers Criminal Justice Library was established in 1921. In 1984 Rutgers University purchased the Criminal Justice/NCCD Collection from the National Council on Crime and Delinquency. The current collection includes 9,500 books, more than 300 current serial titles (including newsletters), 4,000 dissertations, and 32,000 published and unpublished reports.

The primary access tool for the collection is Criminal Justice Abstracts, published by Willow Tree Press. Criminal Justice Abstracts draws heavily on the Rutgers collection.

I would like to express my appreciation to the Conference organisers and hosts; especially Graeme Newman, Ron Clarke, Gerthard Mueller, and Phyllis Schultze.
