CRIMINAL JUSTICE LIBRARIANS' CONFERENCE

The Eighth Conference for Librarians in the Criminal Justice System will be held at the Australian Police Staff College, Manly, in the Northern Suburbs of Sydney from March 31 to April 2 1992.

The Australian Police Staff College is a major sponsor of the Conference. However, the Conference is being organised by the Australian Institute of Criminology and inquiries about the program, accommodation, or other aspects, should be directed to the institute and not to the Staff College.

The Conference theme is: Criminal Justice Cooperation: Libraries Showing the Way.

A number of inquiries about the Conference have already been received from overseas, specifically from New Zealand and the United States. With an anticipated increase in overseas registrations it is likely that participants at the Conference will be well placed to plan for enhanced international, as well as national, library cooperation.

PROFILING THE QUEENSLAND POLICE ACADEMY LIBRARY

INTRODUCTION

The Queensland Police Academy is located at Corinda in the Western Suburbs of Brisbane. The Academy's Library commenced operation in 1972 in an area of the Academy now commonly called the "fish bowl". The collection at that time consisted of a few boxes of books to support the then Police Cadet Training Program.

The Library moved to its current location in 1974. Although this area was originally designed solely as a library, it quickly acquired other tenants and the library operated from one section of a rather large room with shelves used to separate it from other occupants. Over the years the Library grew steadily under the guidance of the Academy Librarian, Erica Bolto.

The present Librarian, Irene Sachs, was appointed in October 1990 following Erica's move to the Criminal Justice Commission Library. In July 1991 the Library, in conjunction with the rest of the Academy, underwent a major renovation and refurbishing in preparation for the first intake of recruits undertaking the new Police Recruit Training Program. Under this program new recruits completed first semester of an undergraduate degree at either Griffith University or Queensland University of Technology and then completed their second semester of study at the Police Academy.

THE LIBRARY NOW

The Library is now the sole occupier of the library area of 655 square metres and has shelving for approximately 22,000 volumes, and seating for 120 library users.

The present library collection consists of 14,000 monographs, 280 serial titles and 110 videos in the areas of policing, law, criminology, sociology and management. A significant percentage of the monograph collection included outdated material in the behavioural sciences and a vigorous weeding program was commenced in November 1991, accompanied by an active acquisitions agenda designed to improve the collection and to support the Academy's teaching curricula as well as meeting the needs of serving police personnel.

The Library is totally manually operated with a card catalogue and manual loans system. At present the only link with outside databases is via a P.C. and modem connection to ABN, Dialog, ORAQLE (the Queensland State Library database) and several other libraries which provide dial in access to their catalogues.

The library has five full-time staff members: two librarians, two library technicians and one administrative assistant. A graduate library assistant is employed on a part-time basis to operate the library on weekends.

HOURS OF OPERATION

Prior to July 1991 the library was open whenever required although library staff were only in attendance from 9 am to 4 pm, Monday to Friday. The need to maintain tighter security of the collection was recognised and library hours were changed as follows:

Monday-Thursday 9 am-9 pm Friday 8 am-5 pm Saturday and Sunday 12 noon to 5 pm

The Library is now kept locked outside these hours and an after hours return chute has been provided for borrowers who wish to return material outside the opening hours.

PUBLICATIONS

The Academy Library produces two publications—a current awareness service and a listing of new books and videos. The current awareness service, Current Notes has been published bi-monthly by the Academy Library since 1978. Unfortunately, this publishing schedule has not been able to be maintained during 1991, although hopes are high for a return to regular production in 1992. A cumulated card index of all articles indexed in Current Notes is maintained alphabetically by subject. This index is very much in demand and will be maintained despite the degree of labour intensity involved until the Library is able to provide access to appropriate



Queensland Police Academy Library periodical indexes though on-line databases, CD ROM technology and other printed indexes.

CONCLUSION

1991 has been a time of tremendous development and change for the Police Academy Library. The introduction of the new Police Recruit Training Program has resulted in significant curriculum changes and this has meant that the Library has had to expand its collection to include a wider range of subject areas and to plan for the additional demands for resources which will be engendered by the second year distance education phase of the program.

Although 1992 promises to be another year of change, reorganisation and development, it will also be one of consolidation and reinforcement of the significant changes which have already occurred in 1991.

WORLD CRIMINAL JUSTICE LIBRARY NETWORK

The June 1991 issue of this Bulletin included news about establishment of the World Criminal Justice Library Network. The Network was established at a Conference of Criminal Justice Librarians held at Rutgers, New Jersey, earlier this year.

The mission of the Network is to:

- develop specific ways of sharing services and criminal justice information on a global scale; and
- enhance communication among Network members.

Network members are now calling for expressions of interest from libraries and agencies around the world who:

- wish to be identified as members of the Network;
- are prepared to participate in the sharing of resources and/or information.

The Australian Institute of Criminology is a member of the Network and is coordinating the response from Australia and New Zealand. We are asking that libraries and agencies that wish to be identified as members of the World Criminal Justice Library Network should forward information about their operation(s) to John Myrtle at the Australian Institute of Criminology. A checklist of appropriate information needed is noted on this page.

A number of agencies in this region are already members of the United Nations Criminal Justice Information Network (UNCJIN). These include:

- New Zealand Department of Justice
- New South Wales Department of Corrective Services
- South Australian Department of Correctional Services
- Queensland Corrective Services Commission
- Australian Institute of Criminology.

While UNCJIN is not the sole means of communication for the Network, it does offer the benefit of being a worldwide system of communication; being cheap and easy to use; and already having a Library bulletin board prepared for the use of Network members. Potential members of the library network should therefore consider joining up as members of UNCJIN.

It should be emphasised that there are no fixed or direct charges associated with Network membership. We are seeking to establish cooperative links and mechanisms in order to cope with the explosion of criminal justice information in a cost efficient manner.

A leafler with information about the World Criminal Justice Library Network is now available from the Australian Institute of Criminology. The leaflet includes projects to be undertaken by the Network over the next two years, and also lists the Network's foundation members.

ROYAL COMMISSION INTO ABORIGINAL DEATHS IN CUSTODY

Data from four studies conducted by the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody have been deposited with the Social Science Data Archives at the Australian National University.

The studies, listed in more detail below, cover both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal deaths in custody and in non-custodial corrections, incidences of self-harm (not necessarily suicide) in custody, and characteristics of all instances of police custody. Each study provides information about age, sex, and race of the individual,

dates and times in question, the most serious offence committed by the individual, and the State or Territory concerned.

The first study group, the National Police Custody Survey, Australia, August 1988 (SSDA No.601) surveyed the characteristics of all instances of police custody in Australia during a one-month period. The census included details of the timing and reasons for an individual's entry into and exit from custody.

The second study, Deaths in Non-Custodial Corrections, Australia and New Zealand, 1987-1988 (SSDA No.602), reports characteristics of all deaths which occurred among people servicing non-custodial correctional orders during the two-year period in Australia and New Zealand. Non-custodial correctional orders' included all orders which involve some form of supervision of a person by a correctional authority outside an institution. Topics cover in this study included the time and manner of the individual's death, responsibility for the death (e.g. suicide, accident), characteristics of the individual's correctional order, and use of alcohol or drugs. Background variables included marital status, employment status, mental health history, physical health history, and correctional history.

The third study, Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal Deaths in Custody, Australia 1980-1989 (SSDA No.603), places Aboriginal deaths in the context of all deaths which occurred in custody in Australia during the 1980s. Topics covered include the time, environment and cause of the death, amount of time since the last inspection of the prisoner, responsibility for the death (e.g. suicide, accident), characteristics of the custody (legal status, number of days in custody, custodial authority)

Fourthly, Self-Inflicted Harm in Custody, Australia 1989 (SSDA No.604) describes all incidences of self-harm, including attempted suicides, which occurred in custody in Australia during a five-month period, from April 10 August, 1989. The interest was in both attempted suicide (whether the person actually intended to die from the attempt or not) and other forms of self-harm, such as lacerations. This study surveyed the time, place and form of self-injury, the immediate reaction of custodial staff and subsequent action (e.g. bail to attend hospital, counselling), and the use of alcohol or drugs.
