Editorial

n this issue of the Bulletin, we are including details of two initiatives that should be welcomed by criminal justice librarians, professionals and support staff throughout this region.

Both of these initiatives had their gestation in the Criminal Justice Librarians' Conference. held in Sydney earlier this year. Firstly, the Institute's Library is collecting entries for a Directory of Criminal Justice Libraries in Australia and New Zealand. Secondly we have arranged with ILANET at the State Library of NSW to set up a messaging facility for criminal justice libraries.

In the June issue of the Bulletin, we included an item about access to NCJRS microfiche documents, produced in the US by the National Criminal Justice Research Service. We requested Australian libraries to forward information about the extent of their NCJRS holdings. Thus far, I have only received one response. I am sure that there are more than a handful of our libraries with NCJRS holdings. It would be of great assistance to all users of the NCJRS Database if we had some idea of the extent of Australian holdings, so please tell us about your NCJRS holdings.

Australian Prisoners 1991 Results of the National Prison Census 30 June 1991

The Australian Institute of Criminology recently released the results of the 1991 National Prison Census, which collected details of the characteristics of the 15,021 prisoners in custody in Australia on 30 June last year.

The report, compiled by John Walker, Senior Criminologist at the Institute, from data assembled by the state and territory Corrective Services departments, shows that the total prison population increased by 715 (5 per cent) during the year 1990-91, with New South Wales (up 736) and South Australia (up 111) leading the way. By contrast, the Queensland prison population fell by 202, due mainly to a number of schemes aimed at diverting minor offenders to sentences served in the community.

The proportions of prisoners under 25 years of age fell during the year, as did the proportions of women prisoners and prisoners born overseas.

Despite the efforts made to reduce the imprisonment of Aboriginal people after the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody, their numbers and proportion increased in most jurisdictions, and they were still 18 times more likely to be in prison than non-Aboriginals.

The offences for which people were on remand or serving sentences were mainly similar to previous figures. The proportion of prisoners held for drug offences fell slightly while those in prison for assaults increased. Fine defaulters and other persons serving relatively short sentences increased in number and in proportion.

One new and interesting feature of the report is Part D: Summary of Trends in Key Characteristics of Prison Populations, 1982-1991. This section presents annual trends over the past decade for basic indicators such as total prisoner numbers, remandee numbers, and receptions of sentenced prisoners. Another fundamental indicator is a measure of the flow of prisoners into the prison system during this period.

Prisoners are now more likely to be under 25 years of age than they were in 1982, more likely to be female, more likely to be Aboriginal, and more likely to be remandees. On the other hand, they are less likely to be serving sentences of more than five years, to be doing time for fine defaults only, or for driving offences or property offences.

New ILANET Service

Users of ILANET will be pleased to know that there is now a messaging system available for criminal justice libraries and agencies.

ILANET, Information and Libraries Access Network, is an enterprise of the State Library of NSW. It is a DIALCOM electronic mail and database access system which is widely used by Australian libraries.

The Australian Institute of Criminology recently contacted Sandra Davey of the ILANET administration with a request to compile a group mailbox of libraries or agencies on ILANET who may wish to be messaged on criminal justice issues.

A list of 27 ILANET users has been compiled. The list has been called: JUSTICE.

What the list allows you to do is simultaneously send a message to all of the ILANET users on the JUSTICE list, that is all with some interest in criminal justice. Just address the message to JUSTICE, instead of to an individual mailbox.

It is important to note that for the cost of one message, an ILANET user can send a message to all on the JUSTICE list. The message is sent simultaneously to the 27 ILANET mail boxes.

Clearly the facility will be useful to all of us who want to publicise events, new publications, or just keep in touch with colleagues. Sandra Davey has indicated that a number of Queensland criminal justice libraries will be joining ILANET from September and these new users will be added to the JUSTICE list as they join up.

Note: Because ILANET is a DIALCOM messaging system, its database access facility can be used for accessing the United Nations Criminal Justice Information Network (UNCJIN). UNCJIN now has more than 40 members spread through 15 countries and these members include several criminal justice agencies from Australia and New Zealand.
