#### Editorial

n recent years an increasing number of Australians have been discovering the benefits of electronic mail, either at work or in support of personal interests or leisure activities.

As we outlined in the last issue of the Bulletin, Australian libraries have been using electronic mail since the early 1980s, either in the form of ILANET or in one of its earlier mutant forms. The emergence of AARNet in the academic sphere has dramatically increased the personal use of electronic mail in the workplace. All that is needed is access to a personal computer and a modem or some sort networked communications Services such as UNCJIN have also enhanced world-wide communications.

The Director and staff Sydney University's Institute of Criminology have now initiated a facility called CRIMNET that will enable criminal justice professionals in Australia to communicate in a fast and cost effective way, not only with colleagues in Australia. but also with like-minded individuals throughout the world. In this issue, Fiona Wright outlines the CRIMNET service and explains how it works.

#### CRIMNET

#### Introduction

Interest in criminal justice information networks has increased across Australia in recent years. For six months in 1990, Professor Graeme Newman was based at the Faculty of Law at the University of Sydney. Professor Graeme Newman is a distinguished expatriate Australian criminologist based at the State University of New York, Albany in the USA. He is an expert in computer network systems and played a leading role in establishing the United Nations Criminal Justice

Information Network (UNCJIN). Graeme's time in Australia stimulated academics and librarians to investigate the technology available in Australia for reliable electronic communication.

Recent discussions between staff of Sydney University's Institute of Criminology, the Australian Institute of Criminology, the Department of Criminology at the University of Melbourne, and the Crime Research Centre at the University of Western Australia, led to the creation of an electronic mailing list (also called a distribution list) that could be accessed via AARNet and related systems.

The facility is called CRIMNET and it is an electronic criminal justice information network. It is a technique of electronic telecommunication and aims to fulfil the need for a simple means of regular and relaxed communication between criminal justice institutions and professionals throughout Australia. It provides a painless method of communication amongst staff of criminal justice agencies in relation to criminological and criminal justice issues.

#### Joining or Subscribing to CRIMNET

You may subscribe to CRIMNET if you are part of a computer network. In the majority of cases in Australia this will probably be AARNET (which stands for Australian Academic Research Network). Your membership of CRIMNET should not involve any charge, over and above the costs involved in using your electronic mail system.

Joining up involves sending a message to the first of the two mailing addresses involved in the running of CRIMNET.

The first address is:

LISTSERV@SULAW (or listserv@sulaw)

This is called the mailing list server. It handles various commands such as adding people to the list and fetching messages from the archives etc.

CRIM-L@SULAW (or crim-l@sulaw)

This is the address to which people send the mail which is to be sent to everyone else on the list. Mail sent to crim-l@sulaw will be retransmitted to everyone who has subscribed. All messages sent to this address will also be archived and thus may later be retrieved.

In order to become a subscriber to CRIMNET the first thing you must do is to send a message to listserv@sulaw asking for a subscription. This message will take the form:

SUBSCRIBE CRIM-L <full name>
e.g. SUBSCRIBE CRIM-L Fiona Wright

If you have successfully sent the message to listserv@sulaw you will receive the following message:

Subscription requests are not automatic for this list.

Your request has been forwarded to fionaw@sulaw.law.su.oz.au for approval. Approvals will usually take no more than 2 days.

Once your subscription has been approved you will receive a message saying:

#### **Using CRIMNET**

The address you will now be using is called CRIM-L@SULAW. The categories of information which may be distributed on the network are:

- Research papers
- Seminars, Conferences, Workshops (including upcoming events, calls for papers)
- Education courses
- Visitors
- Staff movements

- Positions vacant
- Publications (including books, journals, seminar proceedings)
- Queries (help you inquire about any of these categories)

(If you can think of any additional categories, please let us know).

When you wish to distribute a message to the subscribers on the mailing list, you must send your message to the following E mail address:

CRIM-L@sulaw (or crim-l@sulaw-both will work fine).

Each of the above mentioned categories has been assigned a standard prefix. These are as follows:

**EDUC** educational courses MOVE staff movements **PUB** publications RES Research projects seminars, conferences, workshops **SEM** VAC positions vacant VIS visitors OUE queries

When you have determined the category in which your message belongs, you should flag your message with the header CRIMNET, followed by one of the designated categories. e.g. CRIMNET-SEM 'A Just Result: Unsafe...'

#### 2 Research

Earlier this month, Dr David Ranson, Assistant Director, Victorian Institute of Forensic Pathology, used CRIMNET to advertise the establishment of a related Forensic Medicine and Sciences Interest Group Discussion List. The List, to be called Forens-L, is an unmoderated discussion list dealing with forensic aspects of anthropology, biology, chemistry, odontology, pathology, psychology, serology, toxicology, criminalistics, expert witnessing and presentation of evidence in court.

#### **Benefits**

To summarise the benefits of CRIMNET:

- Improved communications—effective and constant communication will facilitate the development of quality and complementary research in criminal justice.
- 2 Enhanced communication will increase the likelihood of effective feedback.
- 3 The use of the distribution list system will be established as a routine activity by researchers and other professionals.
- 4 The system will facilitate access to a wider range of information and research.
- 5 Institutions and individuals will be able to make their activities better known throughout Australia.
- 6 The potential for overseas links exists through related information systems such as UNCJIN, and other data networks.
