Editorial

- n this issue, I have included a short report I on the Second Conference of the World Criminal Justice Librarians' Network which was held recently in Syracusa, Italy, and which I attended as the representative of the Australian Institute of Criminology. addition, before the Conference I visited the United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute (UNICRI) in Rome and after, travelled to the United Kingdom to visit the Home Office in London and the Institute of Criminology in Cambridge. I will report on these other visits in a later issue of this Bulletin.

World Criminal Justice Library Conference

The Second Conference of the World Criminal Justice Library Network was held in Siracusa, Italy from 10 to 13 June, this year. The conference was hosted by the International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences (ISISC) and funded by the International Scientific and Professional Advisory Council of the United Nations Crime Prevention and Crime Prevention Program (ISPAC). There were 27 participants at the Conference. Of these, 23 represented European or North American agencies or universities.

Conference participants acknowledged that in the two-year period since the inaugural Network Conference, there has been rapid and unanticipated progress in the technology of communications, computing and networking. Direct and immediate global communication has been enhanced. Such communication has become cheaper, quicker and more efficient. CD-ROM technology has matured so that a much greater variety of products are now available. The rapid growth in use of the INTERNET highlights the extent of change in networking arrangements.

With a background of such change, almost all participants, when reporting on activities of their own agencies, indicated that they were also having to work within an environment of reduced budgets. For instance, a number of academic libraries reported significant cancellation of serial titles during 1992. With such a scenario any enhanced cooperative arrangements developed through participation in a global network assume a greater importance and value.

One of the highlights of the Conference was a report from Prof Graeme Newman, Coordinator of the United Nations Criminal Justice Information Network, indicating the extent of the expansion of UNCIIN over the past two years. This expansion has not only arisen from the increased number of registered or the increased use of the system, but the fact that UNCJIN is now available in more than one form and is therefore a much more flexible and accessible information tool.

UNCJIN operates under the auspices of the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Branch, Vienna, and additional financial support is provided by the US Bureau of Justice Statistics and the Research Foundation of the State University of New York at Albany.

Access to UNCJIN is now available through either of two communications systems: the DIALCOM system which is administered for UNCJIN by TCN,

or via the INTERNET. Most university sites and some government agencies have direct access to the INTERNET (in Australia, via AARNet). UNCJIN via the INTERNET offers an open discussion on any international criminal justice issues and also access to many data files. During Conference breaks Prof Newman demonstrated UNCJIN on the INTERNET and showed the range of data files now available.

At the Conference, I chaired a session focussing on database development and use. Part of the session involved highlighting the range of criminal justice databases currently available either online or on CD-ROM. In addition, participants discussed the strengths and shortcomings of the databases that are currently available. One major area of concern was the poor coverage of European criminal justice literature in established criminal justice databases. Participants also expressed a desire to be better informed about any in-house or PC-based databases developed by individual agencies.

Summary of Conference Recommendations

- 1. Network libraries with accessions lists will make these lists available to staff at the State University of New York, Albany, USA, so that the information will be loaded and available on UNCJIN for users of the INTERNET. The United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Branch, Vienna, also offered to distribute its lists of grey literature.
- A Network newsletter, Res Rete, has been launched and will be issued at least twice per year for Network members and other libraries. Key regional libraries will assist with the distribution of the newsletter.
- Information on the composition of collections of network libraries will be included in the forthcoming International Directory of Criminal Justice Libraries. It is likely that modified conspectus terminology will be utilised to survey libraries.
- 4. The meeting agreed to contact the publishers of Criminology, Penology, and Police Science Abstracts to encourage publication of a CD-ROM version of the Database. It also canvassed the possibility of cooperation between Criminal Justice Abstracts and Criminology, Penology, and Police Science Abstracts with the view to the production of a more comprehensive and cost effective criminal justice database.
- 5. Members of the Network be encouraged to publicise in-house or PC-based databases through the *International Directory of Criminal Justice Libraries*.

- 6. The International Directory of Criminal Justice Libraries will be published for the World Criminal Justice Library Network by the Australian Institute of Criminology.
- The biennial meetings of the World Criminal Justice Library Network will be supplemented by regional meetings of librarians from relevant agencies and institutes.
- 8. The Network will attempt to obtain funds for connecting and training member libraries for use of the INTERNET/UNCJIN. Any available funds will be available to agencies on the basis of need. Where possible, training will be organised on a regional basis and will also be organised in conjunction with the biennial meetings of the World Network.
- The third meeting of the World Criminal Justice Library Network should be convened in two years and the Network's Steering Committee should investigate potential hosts and sources of funds.

Psychiatry in Court: A New Monograph from Sydney University's Institute of Criminology

A monograph just released by the Institute of Criminology at the University of Sydney suggests that psychiatric evidence is often used inappropriately in court proceedings in Australia. The book, *Psychiatry in Court: the Use(fulness) of Psychiatric Reports and Psychiatric Evidence in Court Proceedings*, was authored by Dr Peter Shea. It proposes that we abandon the unquestioning acceptance of the advice of 'experts' and adopt a more critical and informed approach.

Psychiatry in Court is published by the Institute of Criminology, Faculty of Law, University of Sydney (ISBN 0 867 58673 7) and is available at a recommended retail price of \$25 from the University Cooperative Bookshop.
