Child Abuse and Neglect Database

The Institute's J V Barry Library has recently acquired the Child Abuse and Neglect Database on CD-ROM. The database is produced in Washington by the National Clearinghouse on Child Abuse and Neglect Information. The CD-ROM version has been published on behalf of the Clearinghouse by National Information Services Corporation (NISC). The decision to produce a CD-ROM version of the database is particularly fortunate, given the recent decision by DIALOG to drop Child Abuse and Neglect from DIALOG's online information services.

The database contains more than 17,000 records from 1965 up to the present (late 1993). The major subjects covered include physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional and psychological abuse, and child neglect.

Australian Institute of Criminology Conference Program Outline

The following are intended dates and locations for forthcoming Australian Institute of Criminology Conferences.

- 13-15 April 1994. Preventing Youth Crime: The Challenge Beyond Diversion (held in conjunction with the Juvenile Justice Advisory Council of NSW). Venue: Holiday Inn, Terrigal, NSW. There has been considerable interest and some success in recent years in attempts to divert young offenders from the juvenile courts through informal processes. To complement these moves towards the selective use of the formal justice system and to contain the costs involved, we also need to explore initiatives which are likely to prevent or minimise the commission of crime in the first place. Aims of the conference: 1. To raise awareness and discussion of issues which impact on youth crime. 2. To consider alternative methods of preventing, or minimising youth crime. 3. To encourage the participation of government, community-based and private sector organisations in cooperative ventures aimed at preventing youth crime.
