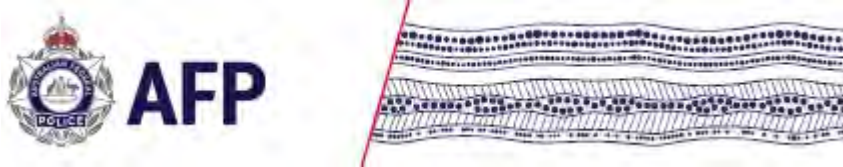

Thanks again for making the time to meet with s 47F and I to discuss the hate crimes database.

As discussed, the first iteration of the dashboard will include data on legislated offences only, which we understand to be s 750 and s 752 of the *Criminal Code Act 2002* (ACT). We are proposing the following data items for the 1 July 2024–30 June 2025 reference period:

- Incident – offence type, date of offence, location of offence, number of identified offenders, nature of victim/s (eg person, property, institution), number of victims
- Identified offender(s) – sex, age, date of police proceeding, outcome (eg arrest, caution, summons), number and nature of concurrent charges
- Identified person victim(s) – sex, age

We are of course happy to refine this list as needed noting that the dashboard is to be finalised in December with data provided in November.

Finally, could you please confirm whether incidents would be identified by charges or reported offences? I believe you said charges, but just want to be certain!

My name is S 47F, I'm working with S 47F on the development of the hate crimes database. I'm emailing to provide an update on the data request and touch base about your involvement.

Following continued consultation with data providing agencies, we are hoping to request unit record data on all incidents involving one or more legislated hate-related offences (referenced in S 47F's email below), regardless of whether an offender has been identified and proceeded against.

We have also been discussing whether dashboard users would be most interested in data on the number of incidents that occurred in 2024–25 or the number of reports/jobs recorded during this time period. We would be interested in your thoughts on this and what may be the easiest to provide?

Finally, we have refined the list of data items to be requested.

- Incident – offence(s), date of incident, location of incident, outcome of incident (eg whether or not the incident was accepted for investigation) number of identified offenders, victim type (eg person, property, institution), number of person victims
- Identified offender(s) – sex, age, date of police proceeding, outcome (eg charge, caution etc), offence(s) for which offender has been proceeded against, number and nature of offences for which offender has been proceeded against concurrently
- Identified person victim(s) – sex, age

Based on this information and your internal discussions, do you think it may be possible to provide 2024–25 data by the end of the month? We are happy to discuss how we may be best able to assist in this process (eg by looking to reduce the number of requested data items).

Great to meet with you and s 47F yesterday about the hate crimes database.

Our understanding from the legislation and yesterday's discussion is that the following offences would be available for the first iteration of the dashboard:

- *Crimes Act 1900* (NSW) s 93Z (Offence of publicly threatening or inciting violence on grounds of race, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity or intersex or HIV/AIDS status)
- *Crimes Act 1900* (NSW) s 93ZAA (Offence of publicly inciting hatred on ground of race)
- *Crimes Act 1900* (NSW) s 93ZA (Offence of displaying Nazi symbols)
- *Crimes Act 1900* (NSW) s 214B (Places of worship)
- *Graffiti Control Act 2008* (NSW) s 4 (Marking premises or property) – noting penalty enhancement applies for committing circumstance of aggravation, including where the premises is a place of worship

s 47F (copied here), who is leading the development of the database, has compared these against ANZSOC with the following codes selected:

- 0442 Threatening behaviour
- 0499 Harm or endanger persons, nec (eg includes inciting violence towards an individual person)
- 1121 Graffiti
- 1219 Public safety offences, nec (eg includes vilify or incite hatred or violence against or towards a group, where this does not amount to terrorism)

It's not immediately clear where s 93ZA aligns but probably 1219 or 1212 Unlawful association (includes use of a symbol, motif, insignia, or uniform that promotes violence or signifies membership to an unlawful group – though this primarily relates to gangs, organised crime, other illegal groups etc). Happy to be guided by you on the appropriate allocation.

With respect to the data items, the following are proposed for the reference period 1 July 2024–30 June 2025:

- Incident
 - offence type
 - date of offence
 - date of police processing
 - location
 - outcome (eg arrest, caution, summons)
- Offender
 - sex
 - age
 - number and nature of concurrent charges
- Victim
 - sex
 - age

There was some discussion about how a non-person 'victim' could be identified without revealing the name of the affected entity. Again, we will be guided by you as to the best arrangement if victim characteristics can be made available.

The dashboard is to be finalised by December with data provided by mid- to late-November, before proceeding to a quarterly request once we have established data providers preferred 'data settling' periods. In 2026, we'll start exploring the incorporation of offences with a hate element into the database.

Thanks again for walking us through your data. We'll wait to hear from you once you have briefed Senior Executive but please feel free to contact s 47F and I in the interim.

At the Police Ministers Council meeting earlier today, s 47F indicated that Queensland data had been provided to the forthcoming hate crimes dashboard. However the AIC does not appear to have received any data. As such, I wanted to touch base to ensure that the data has not gone missing. If data have not been provided, I would be grateful if you could please provide an indication of when we may expect it?

As I have mentioned to you both, we recognise that the legislative framework is more complex in Queensland compared to other jurisdictions. As such, we would be happy to refine the data request by requesting the following data items on only substantive offences (to our knowledge, s 52A and s 52D of the *Criminal Code Act 1899* (Qld)) resulting in a charge:

- Event identifier
- Offence name
- Date of offence
- Location of offence (eg private dwelling, educational facility, street/footpath, place of worship etc)

- Method of police proceeding (eg arrest, summons etc)

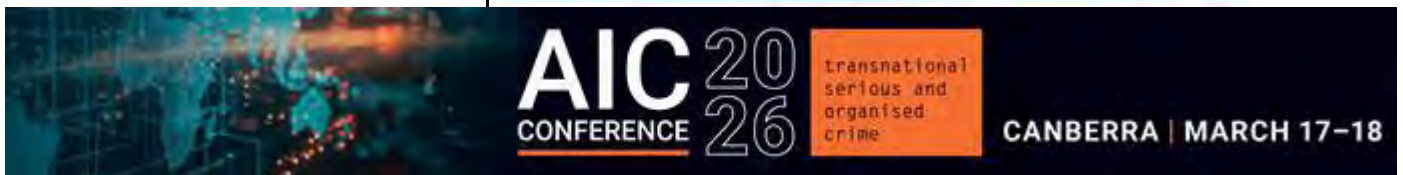

Many thanks to you both for your time this afternoon.

As discussed, the forthcoming hate crimes dashboard intends to present data on legislated hate-related offences where an offender has been identified and proceeded against by police. Our understanding is that this would include the following two South Australian offences:

- s 4 (Racial vilification) of the *Racial Vilification Act 1996* (SA)
- s 32B (Prohibition on use of Nazi salute or Nazi symbols) of the *Summary Offences Act 1952* (SA)

I have attached a summary of legislated offences in all jurisdictions for your reference.

We have now spoken with all police agencies about the establishment of the dashboard. All jurisdictions other than Western Australia, the Northern Territory and Tasmania have indicated their intention to provide data pending internal approvals. The Western Australia Police Force has indicated that the National Criminal Intelligence System is their preferred platform for data provision and will not provide data to the AIC for the purposes of the dashboard. The Northern Territory Police Force and Tasmania Police are unable to provide data as they have no relevant substantive offences.

All data published on the dashboard will be subject to extensive caveats that will be refined in collaboration with data providers.

Yes, the dashboard includes offences related to use of Nazi symbols or gestures. We left it to jurisdictions to determine which offences were in scope and all participating police services chose to include such offences. Further, we have included words to specify that some jurisdictions do not have hate crimes offences per se.

Including Tasmania data in the first release of the dashboard depends on publication timing but we anticipate/prefer a postponement given the events at Bondi yesterday. We will need to create a new page on the dashboard for Tasmania but s 47F believes she can do this reasonably quickly.

Regarding the data, we are revising the codebook but to fast-track data provision I've added the data specs below. Data items with a double asterisk are required for the first release of the dashboard ie offender information does not need to be provided this time.

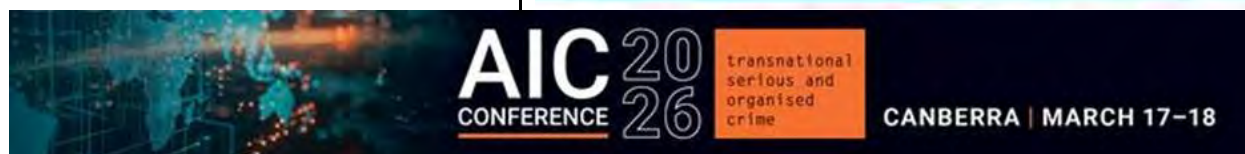

Please find attached the landing page, main menu and Victoria page for the forthcoming hate crimes dashboard. We would be grateful if you could please review and provide any feedback by **COB Tuesday 16 December**.

Further, and with my sincere apologies for the eleventh-hour request, I was wondering if you could please let me know if it would be possible to receive data on offences under the *Criminal Code Act 1995* (Cth) by date, location type and investigation status (ie the same format as the data provided 25 November)? We have recently become aware that state and territory police do, in some circumstances, charge offenders under Commonwealth offences rather than jurisdiction offences.

Looking at the CSA, I can see that there were 49 offences recorded in 2024–25 under s 80.2H (Public display of prohibited Nazi symbols or giving Nazi salute) of the *Criminal Code Act 1995* (Cth). It does not appear that there were offences recorded against any of the other Commonwealth offences of interest, being the following:

- s 80.2A (Advocating force or violence against groups)

- s 80.2B (Advocating force or violence against members of groups or close acquaintances)
- s 80.2BA (Threatening force or violence against groups)
- s 80.2BB (Threatening force or violence against members of groups or close associates)
- s 80.2BC (Advocating damage to or destruction of real property or motor vehicle)
- s 80.2BD (Threatening damage to or destruction of real property or motor vehicle)
- s 80.2BE (Advocating force or violence through causing damage to property)
- s 80.2H (Public display of prohibited Nazi symbols or giving Nazi salute)
- s 80.2HA (Public display of prohibited terrorist organisation symbols)

We would use the information from CSA however as previously mentioned have decided to present data on offences resulting in a charge only.

I appreciate that the scope of this data request has changed a number of times and appreciate your patience and understanding. More than happy to call if you'd like to discuss.

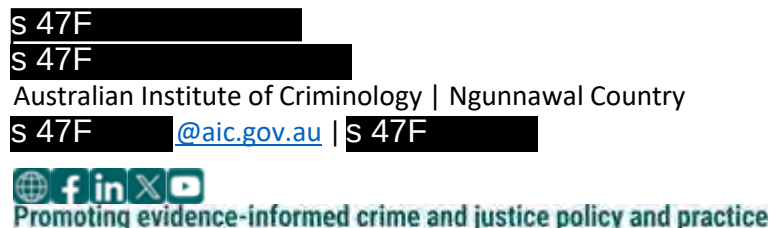

Many thanks for your time last week to discuss the hate crimes database, it was great to meet you both.

As discussed, we were initially hoping to receive unit-record data to facilitate a more exploratory and detailed analysis of incidents involving a hate crime. This is the arrangement we have in place with the two other data providers who we have met with so far. That said, we of course appreciate that the provision of unit-record data comes with additional ethical considerations and resourcing requirements, so is unlikely to be possible in the first instance. Perhaps something we can revisit moving forwards once the database is up and running and we have a clearer idea of future directions?

Since our meeting we spent a bit of time looking at the Crime Statistics Agency website (such a brilliant resource!), and great that this provides us with an offence count. While we are yet to confirm exactly what data will be published on the dashboard, we expect we would also like to present an incident count. Do you think it may be possible to obtain this?

Below is the list of variables that we are requesting from all data providers. I have bolded the ones that we are particularly interested in. It would be great to hear whether you think it may be possible to receive these, either through provision of unit-record data or aggregate data?

- Incident – offence type, date of offence, **location of offence (description eg religious institution, public place), number of identified offenders, nature of victim/s (eg person, property, institution), number of victims**
- Identified offender(s) – sex, age, date of police proceeding, **outcome (eg arrest, caution, summons),** number and nature of concurrent charges
- Identified person victim(s) – sex, age

Finally, just wanted to confirm that we are interested in data relating to the following offences:

- *Racial and Religious Tolerance Act 2001* (Vic)

Apologies for the confusion on the sections. If possible, we would be grateful to receive a version of Table 1 that includes offences under s 24 and s 25 of this Act for the 2024–25 FY. As we are now working towards a finalisation data of 12 December 2025 for the dashboard, could you please let me know whether you may be able to provide these data by **5 December 2025**?

While I'm here, I'd also like to provide you with an update on the scope of the dashboard. Following consultations with all data providing agencies, the AIC has determined that the national hate crimes dashboard will present data on **legislated hate-related offences for which an offender has been charged**. This narrower scope should allow for consistent data to be provided by all jurisdictions. We intend to publish offence counts and high-level location data

for each jurisdiction noting concerns pertaining to information about victims of these offences. We will provide you with a copy of the Victorian data to be presented on the dashboard prior to finalisation for your review.

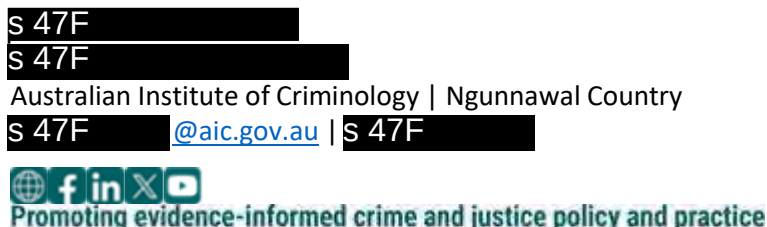

As you can see the numbers are very small therefore we will proceed with aggregate data as it is all available from the Crime Statistics Agency.

If there are no records for a particular offence, it means no offences were recorded for it as the table above does not include records for zero offences.

To gather the remaining aggregate information we will put in a CSA data request for you to help get you started and which you can then obtain directly from the CSA each quarter.

The CSA publish all of these aspects which you would have seen on the website:

- Offences (including location and investigation status)
- Incidents
- Alleged offenders (including age and sex)
- Victims (although not statute and I suspect these offences are all statute – see note below)
- They can also provide data on cooccurring offences although it isn't in their standard website collection

Statute victims: This means there is no person or business information captured in a structured data field.

This is a known limitation of statute offences for example a breach of an intervention order, or fail to answer bail fall into the same category.

I hope that makes sense in the language I'm using – I'm saying statute victim as that is what I see used in LEAP but not sure if this is common in other systems.

I have sent through a request for the following to the CSA and will forward to you as soon as I have it.

The details of the request are as follows:

For the specific offences listed please provide tables for the last 2 full years, by year

Offences recorded by offence code and:

- By month offence recorded in
- By location type
- By investigation status
- By co-occurring offences (this can be grouped at the Act level e.g. what offences have co-occurred with selected offences from the *Racial and Religious Tolerance Act 2001*)

Criminal incident counts by FY

- Number of unique offenders per incident, per Act group is OK if offence codes are too small

Alleged offender incidents:

- By age and sex
- By co-occurring charges
- By outcome

I'll keep you updated with progress but in the meantime the attached offences recorded data is already in the public domain so feel free to include it in your reporting.

Many thanks for your time last week to discuss the hate crimes database, it was great to meet you both. As discussed, we were initially hoping to receive unit-record data to facilitate a more exploratory and detailed analysis of incidents involving a hate crime. This is the arrangement we have in place with the two other data providers who we have met with so far. That said, we of course appreciate that the provision of unit-record data comes with additional ethical considerations and resourcing requirements, so is unlikely to be possible in the first instance. Perhaps something we can revisit moving forwards once the database is up and running and we have a clearer idea of future directions?

Since our meeting we spent a bit of time looking at the Crime Statistics Agency website (such a brilliant resource!), and great that this provides us with an offence count. While we are yet to confirm exactly what data will be published on the dashboard, we expect we would also like to present an incident count. Do you think it may be possible to obtain this?

Below is the list of variables that we are requesting from all data providers. I have bolded the ones that we are particularly interested in. It would be great to hear whether you think it may be possible to receive these, either through provision of unit-record data or aggregate data?

- Incident – offence type, date of offence, **location of offence (description eg religious institution, public place), number of identified offenders, nature of victim/s (eg person, property, institution), number of victims**
- Identified offender(s) – sex, age, date of police proceeding, **outcome (eg arrest, caution, summons)**, number and nature of concurrent charges
- Identified person victim(s) – sex, age

Finally, just wanted to confirm that we are interested in data relating to the following offences:

- *Racial and Religious Tolerance Act 2001* (Vic)
 - s 7 (Racial vilification unlawful)
 - s 8 (Religious vilification unlawful)
